

Good Standing Policy

At Tambrey Primary School, all students commence the year with and retain 'good standing' whilst exhibiting behaviours that align with the school's values and beliefs. This is articulated in the school's behaviour policy and also the Department of Education's 'Keeping Our Workplace Safe Initiative'. The Good Standing Policy is also supported by our Positive Behaviour Support Program at Tambrey which reinforces our STAR behaviours; Strive for Personal Growth, Take Responsibility, Act Safe and Respect.

To maintain 'Good Standing' students must:

- Comply with the Tambrey Primary School's behaviour policy and,
- Follow the school's Positive Behaviour Support program.

It is the responsibility of each student to maintain their 'Good Standing'. Students with 'Good Standing' are eligible to participate in various activities throughout the school year. Examples of these may include excursions, camps, interschool sporting events and sports days as well as Star Celebration Days, lunchtime clubs, Student Leadership Positions and after school programs i.e. (STEM).

Students will lose their 'Good Standing' as a consequence of a suspension or a series of behaviours that are not aligned with the school behaviour policy.

Parents and Caregivers of students who lose their 'Good Standing' will be contacted by a member of the School Leadership Team. This will be through a phone call and then formally via letter/email.

Severe Clause:

- Students will lose the privilege to participate in activities where the safety of others is a concern. Any form of violence will result in the loss of 'Good Standing'.
- Students who are involved in a 'one off' severe behaviour incident in the classroom or playground will automatically lose their 'good standing'.

Students will have their 'Good Standing' reinstated:

- By participating in restorative and educative processes to re-establish positive behaviour.
- After a re-entry meeting and/or individual behaviour plan focusing on the identified areas for improvement.
- At the end of 15 school days that the student attends school and shows positive behaviour choices.





The Good Standing Policy has been developed to maintain consistency in our decision-making processes. It is important to note that these are guidelines and that exceptions may be made if there are extenuating circumstances.
